## Online Tutoring from the Division of Academic Enhancement

Online **math** tutoring is offered 8 pm-10 pm Sunday through Thursday during the summer semester and 10 pm-midnight during the fall and spring semesters.

Music students can also make an online **writing** appointment for assistance with essays, articles, papers, and theses. This is an instructional service focusing on local errors (i.e., helping students self-identify and improve on their proof reading and editing skills).
